DECLARATION OF ETHEL [REDACTED]

I, ETHEL [REDACTED] hereby declare as follows:

1. My maiden name was Ethel [REDACTED] I was born on May 25, 1989 and am now 25 years old. I live in Indiana, where I have been a Certified Nurse's Assistant for three years and am currently completing nursing school. My expected graduation date is June 10, 2015. I was recently married. I am very rarely in touch with my biological father, Larry Pohlschneider, who is currently in prison for supposedly molesting me and my siblings.
2. As a child I was raped by my step-father Albert Harris, whom I called "Daddy Albert." When I was 12 years old my parents found a picture of my sister Ashley and that led to the discovery of what Albert had been doing to us. The police investigation began shortly after that and he was eventually arrested.
3. Larry Pohlschneider never sexually molested me. I only ever said that he had because the people asking me questions kept repeating the questions over and over, and it was obvious what they wanted me to say.
4. I recall the following about the investigation of Albert and Larry:
5. Once the police began to investigate Albert, I was interviewed many times by police, CPS case workers, and other people. I do not remember exactly how many times or how many different people questioned me, but I remember that it happened a lot. It seemed like they thought they had to keep talking to us after they found the picture of Ashley.
6. Specifically, I remember talking a lot with a woman who had an office above the jail in Red Bluff, on the second floor. We had to enter through a back

door to get to the office. I do not remember this woman's name or what her job was. My mother or Larry would take us to speak with this woman but they had to wait outside while we talked. This woman asked us about Albert. She used a doll and repeatedly asked us to show her where we had been touched. The woman hinted about Larry abusing us too but never outright asked about him or said it. We had to visit with this woman a lot.

7. A few months after Albert was picked up, the police began questioning me, Ashley, David, and Alan about Larry Pohlschneider. One afternoon, the police or people working for the prosecutor picked me up from school before my mom was supposed to come get us. Detective Flowerdew was there. I do not remember how many times I spoke with Detective Flowerdew before this nighttime interview but I know I met with him before that day.
8. During this interview, they would not take us home even though we asked, or let us get food, until they were finished asking us questions. I was hungry, needed to use the bathroom, and wanted to go home during the entire time the police were asking me questions. I wanted to get out of there very badly and complained many times about being hungry, wanting to see my siblings, and wanting to go to the bathroom. Eventually, I just gave in and lied, saying what they wanted to hear.
9. I tried to tell the detectives who questioned me during the investigation that Larry never touched me in a sexual way, but they told me they knew Larry had abused me. They told me that Larry had failed a lie detector test and that my siblings had already told them that he had abused them. They told me

- they knew Larry touched us and to stop lying about it. They told me I was lying and that people who lie go to jail. I was scared because I was just a kid.
10. I felt pressured by the police, the social worker and the woman from CPS to say those things about Larry. The social worker talked to us about Larry a lot, she also believed that Larry molested us.
 11. The police also told me that I could not go home until I told them what they wanted to hear, so I lied about Larry. They kept asking me the same questions over and over, just rewording the questions and asking again. The police also used the dolls when questioning me and asked the same questions. I was tired and had been questioned for hours so I told them what I thought would get me and my siblings out of the interviews.
 12. The police would not let my siblings and I stay in the same room as each other during these interviews, which is what we wanted and asked for. As the oldest, I felt that I needed to do something to help my younger siblings out of the interviews so I told the police what they wanted to hear.
 13. I went to court to set things right and tell the truth, but when I got back to my foster mom's house, she told us we were in a lot of trouble. She was very angry and said we were going to go to hell for lying on the Bible and that we were the devil for lying in court. She scared me until I gave in. She forced me to write a letter saying I had lied on the stand. I think she wanted to keep us in her house so she made us say that Larry had molested us.
 14. I did not feel pressure from my mother or other family members to say anything specific about Larry. My mother just encouraged me to tell the truth.

I do not remember speaking to anyone who was working for Larry's defense. I may have been interviewed by someone at my foster mother's house, in front of my foster mother. When she was around, I felt very pressured to accuse Larry because of all of the mean things that she said to me. Any time I told any person that Larry had molested me, I was just trying to get them to leave me alone.

15. I told the truth when I was in court on the witness stand. Larry Pohlschneider never touched me sexually or molested me in any way.

I declare that the foregoing is true and correct under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California.
